GENERAL BACKGROUND (A)

LOCATION AND AREA

Chile is located on the South West coast of South America, from 17° 30′ to 90° latitude South and from 66° 30′ to 75° 40′ longitude West. It is about 4,270 km long from the Peruvian border to Cape Horn. The length is more than 8,000 km when taking into account the Antarctic Territory. The average width of the country is about 188 km.

Parts of the Chilean territory are the portion of the Antarctic Continent that lies between 530 and 900 longitude West; Easter Island, located about 270 latitude South and 1090 longitude West; the archipelago of Juan Fernández and the islands of San Félix, San Ambrosio and Sala y Gómez.

The continental and insular area is 756,626 square kilometers, and the Antarctic area is 1,250,000 square kilometers. This means that the total area amounts to 2,006,626 square kilometers, excluding territorial waters.

BOUNDARIES.

Chile is bounded on the North by Perú, by a border line known as "Línea de la Concordia"; on the East by Bolivia and Argentina, mainly by a line that runs through the highest summits of the Andes; on the South by the South Pole, and on the West by the Pacific Ocean, including 200 nautical miles of territorial waters.





GENERAL BACKGROUND:

The Chilean population is small compared to that of countries of older cultures. Notwithstanding this, it has experienced considerable growth during the last 135 years. According to censal figures, Chilean population as of 1835 was 1,010,000 people. In 1895, it was 2,696,000; in 1907 it amounted to 3,213,000, by 1940 it had grown to 5,024,000, and in 1960 it was 7,374,000. The latest census, held in 1970, shows a figure of 8,885,000 inhabitants. Estimates as of June 30, 1980, indicate a total of 11,104,293 inhabitants.

This steady increase could be due mainly to the persistence of moderately high birth rates up to 1962 (an average of 37.50/o), and to a decline in the mortality rate, which produced an increase in the life expectancy of Chileans (64.2 years in 1975, 65.7 years in 1979 and 67.01 years expected for the 1980-1985 period).

During the past few years, Chilean population has experienced a process of slow ageing, due to a quick decrease in fertility. The current birth rate is about 2.10/o, while the general mortality rate is 0.70/o, and the natural rate of growth is 1.50/o per annum.

Rural population prevailed up to 1940. For instance, it was $73^{\circ}/o$ in 1875 and $54^{\circ}/o$ in 1920. The relation changes beginning with the 1952 census; the census of 1970 showed that rural population represented only 24.90/o.

GOVERNMENT SYSTEM: POLITICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE ORGANIZATION

According to the 1980 Constitution, Chile is a unitarian state. For administrative and interior government purposes, the country is divided into regions, and these, into provinces. For the purpose of local administration, the provinces are subdivided into communes.

The regional, provincial and communal government systems are hierarchically structured. At the head of each regions administration is the intendant, who is in charge of directing and administrating the Region's, and is advised by a Regional Council of Development and a Regional Secretariat of Planning and Coordination.

The government and administration of each province are in charge of a Governor, who is subordinated to the Regional Intendant whom he represents. He is assisted by an Advisory Technical Committee and by a Provincial Council.

In charge of communal government is the Mayor, assisted by a Communal Council of Development and by a Communal Secretariat of Planning and Coordination.

The basis of the system is the commune, since it is there that organized participation of the community takes place. Within the system, the Ministries act in a decentralized way by means of Regional Ministerial Secretariats.
